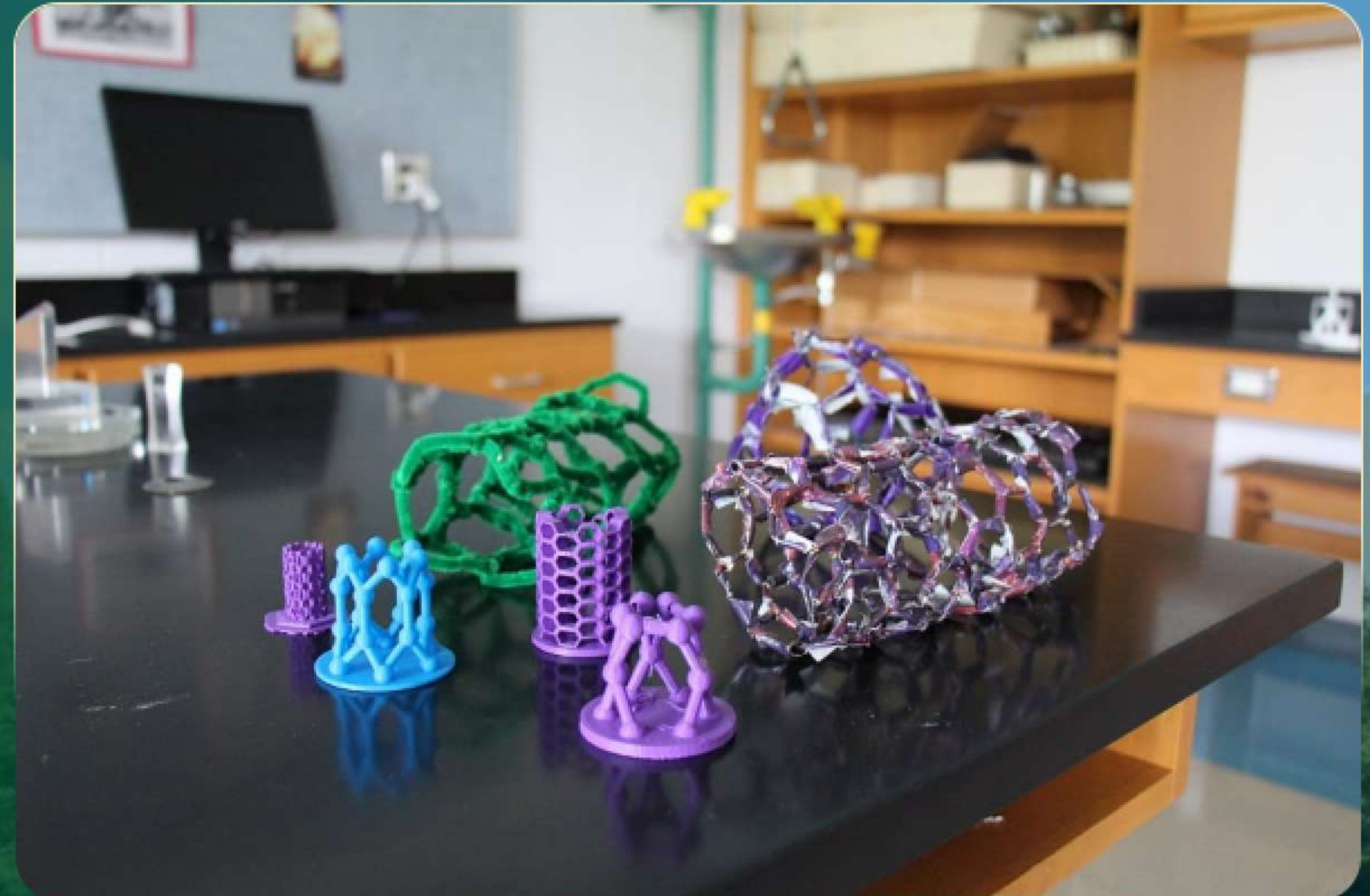

Meals will be provided during the program period according to the daily schedule



FEES

40,000 RMB/person

The program fee covers tuition, on-campus accommodation, meals during the program period, and all scheduled visits and program-related activities.

Exclusions

The program fee does not cover:

- Transportation to and from Beijing, including travel from a student's home city or country to the designated arrival point.
- Passport and visa expenses, personal spending, telephone or data charges, optional attractions or activities outside the official itinerary, and baggage check-in or excess luggage fees.
- Any additional costs arising from personal circumstances or actions, including but not limited to baggage handling services, laundry, communication expenses, driver overtime or excess mileage charges, personal medical treatment, transport to and from hospital, recovery of lost personal items, and compensation for damage or loss caused by personal negligence, misconduct, or violation of school, hotel, or camp regulations.

Visa

Students are responsible for securing any visa required for travel to China. After enrollment is confirmed, the program may issue supporting documents as needed for the visa application process.

Insurance

The program will provide insurance coverage for enrolled students during the official program period.

Safety Requirements

The health, safety, and wellbeing of students are central to the program. Participants are expected to follow all campus regulations, staff instructions, and activity guidelines. Families should disclose any relevant medical, dietary, or personal support needs before the program begins so that appropriate arrangements can be made.
